~ Dessert Wines ~

Dessert wines fall into two categories. Fortified wines—which include port from Portugal, port-style wine made in other regions, sherry, and Madeira—have spirits (generally brandy) added after fermentation to kick the alcohol content and sweetness up a notch. Unfortified dessert wines, such as ice wine and Sauternes, derive their flavor and relatively high alcohol content from the not-yet-fermented juice being concentrated through various methods

Often aged in small oak barrels, increasing their complexity, this white wine grape yields wines of tremendous character and magnificent flavors that are often described as buttery, creamy, nutty or smoky. Usually medium to full bodied in style, Chardonnay also offers fruit aromas and flavors that include apples, lemon, melon, and pineapple.

Racy, keen edged and refreshing, Sauvignon Blanc is arguably one of the best California whites to serve with food thanks to their vibrant acidity and clean, fresh flavors. Robert Mondavi gave the varietals a forward push when he introduced Fume Blanc, a Sauvignon Blanc that has been barrel fermented giving it an oak quality.

~ Pinot Grigio ~ [Pee~noh Gree~jee~oh]

Pinot Grigio is a light-bodied, lean wine that is light in color with crisp and acidic flavors. The white grape variety of Pinot Grigio is generally from California and Italy but can also be found in Alsace, France where it is known as Pinot Gris. Usually crisp and light in body and color Pinot Grigio can also be rich, fat and honeyed.

~ Riesling ~ [REES-ling]

Often described as crisp, and fruity with the flavors of apples, peach and grapefruit, Riesling is well known for its balance of sugar and acidity. Riesling is a variety which is highly “terroir-expressive,” meaning that the character of Riesling wines is very clearly influenced by the region in which it was produced.

This wine is usually paired with white fish and pork dishes.

The merlot grape is one of the two primary grapes of Bordeaux; the other is the Cabernet Sauvignon grape. Merlot is also one of four grapes considered to be a classic red. In the French language, Merlot means “young black bird,” alluding to the grapes beautiful dark black color. Merlot is usually medium bodied wine with flavors of berry, plum, and currant.

Cabernet Sauvignon is another of the red grapes to be considered a classic which shows with vast ranges of quality, structure, and maturity. Its fruity flavors often include rich cherry, black currant, cassis, eucalyptus, and tobacco (referring to older vintages). The third of the classic red grapes, the name Pinot Noir is derived from the French words for pine and black, referring to the varietals tightly clustered dark purple pinecone shaped bunches of fruit. Pinot Noir is widely considered to produce some of the finest wines in the world but is seen as difficult to cultivate and transform into wine.

Syrah and Shiraz are both names for the same red wine grape. Syrah gained its reputation in France's Rhone region while Shiraz refers to grapes grown in Australia. They can produce either a fruity wine that is preferred by "sweet" red wine drinkers, or a dry wine preferred by those who enjoy stronger spicy and peppered qualities.
